874/02/23.C Welcome & Introductions

The Chairman, Councillor Connor, opened the meeting and thanked everyone for attending. Thanks were extended to Councillor Wickson for arranging for the heating to be on and also for setting out the tables and chairs for the meeting – any help available before future meetings would be appreciated.

Public Session

Whilst there were no members of the public in attendance, a communication had been received prior to the meeting which referenced issues that have been on recent agendas.

a. The surface of the Shrewsbury Road through the village

This was a topic on a recent highways meeting with TWC and the Parish Council was assured that, although the highway does not look to be in good repair, regular monitoring takes place and it is technically serviceable. It is included on a list of 'to do' projects when resources are available or if the condition deteriorates.

b. The condition of Silver Hill

This will be reported to TWC via My Telford.

c. HGV traffic movements – Simmonds Transport

The Parish Council has met with TWC and with Simmonds Transport on different occasions and has a good working relationship with them. It has been confirmed that there are no restrictions on the haulage company. Local residents have commented on the respect that drivers have for the local road network, however if information is available on specific matters, these can be added to a future agenda for discussion.

c) High Ercall Churchyard Extension

The Parish Council had previously agreed to add the churchyard extension to the order for one cut in order to support the Parochial Church Council with its maintenance. Funding for this addition had been included in the budget for 2023/24.

It was proposed by Councillor Hartshorn and seconded by Councillor Hughes, all were in favour and thus it was

RESOLVED that the strimming of the churchyard extension will be added to the Maintenance Contract with Nobridge Limited for 2023.

880/02/23.C Planning

a) Report

The Chairman of the Planning Committee gave a report on planning matters since the last meeting. There had been no decisions.

b) Planning Applications for consideration

TWC/2023/0064 Land East and South of Angel Centre, Osbaston Installation of a Solar Farm and Infrastructure.

Councillor Bentley declared an interest as a Member of TW Plans Board and left the meeting

The Chairman of the Planning Committee presented the Minutes, and updated Members, on the meeting held at Ellerdine Village Hall on 17th February 2023.

Other points raised by Members included:

- The need for a decommissioning plan up to 40 years a firm commitment that the company will reinstate the land (and not leave it to the landowner to fund)
- Light pollution / reflection monitor at the planning stage need to avoid visual intrusion
 all practical measures to mitigate against this as much as possible
- Roofs of the containers?
- Connection to the Grid at Hortonwood concern regarding the land, highways and developments along the route

Councillor Connor had engaged with the agent and developer and appreciated this opportunity early in the process. This is a comprehensive application, containing a lot of detail. Two main objections from local residents have been drainage / screening and the construction traffic. The agent has confirmed that direct dialogue on these matters has taken place and agreements reached.

TW Planning Authority must take into consideration the recommendations from the Shropshire Archaeological Group and West Mercia Police. There will also be a need to address the route taking into consideration the response from Cadent Gas.

This is a significant application in the Parish and it was therefore agreed that the Parish Council should call- in the application for determination by the Planning Committee.

It was proposed by Councillor Connor and seconded by Councillor Hughes that the application should be supported subject to conditions, all were in favour and thus it was

RESOLVED that the Parish Council supports the application, subject to the following conditions:

- . Those concerns raised by local residents and neighbours to the site are addressed satisfactorily
- Recommendations from Shropshire Archaeological Group, West Mercia Police and Cadent be taken into consideration
- A decommissioning plan (for up to 40 years, with relevant funding) is in place
- If the LPA is minded to grant permission, a condition must be added that the landscape planting
 and screening should be in place some time prior to construction and that transport
 arrangements and operating hours during construction are clear and agreed in advance
- The Parish Council accepts the community benefit grant of £50,000 on behalf of the residents and would ask for this be paid in three staged payments the first being when the planning permission is granted, then when work commences on site and the third towards completion.

The Parish Councils believes that the Planning Authority will wish to be satisfied that connection to the grid is viable and available before granting consent.

c) Ercall Magna Neighbourhood Development Plan

A detailed response from TWC explained why the final consultation for Regulation 16 cannot take place before the elections.

It was confirmed that the boundary for the Neighbourhood Development Plan would not change and would include Roden and Poynton as planned.

a) Updates and New Issues

882/02/23.C Highways & Transport Matters

a) Highways Liaison Meeting

The Minutes of the meeting had been circulated. Members agreed it was a good meeting and useful to have all the officers in attendance to discuss the many outstanding projects.

b) Roden Road Safety Scheme

The revised scheme had been circulated to Members and all were in agreement that this should move forward to public consultation as soon as possible. TWC had agreed to send individual letters to all Roden residents and encourage people to send in their views.

c) Speed Indicator Device Project

The SID has been at our site in Poynton for a few weeks and residents have confirmed that it does successfully slow most of the 'through' traffic. The SID will move to its second location in the near future.

d) Speeding in Shrewsbury Road

The data from WMP has not yet been received. This will be required before further discussions regarding speed enforcement between The Cleveland Arms and Shirlowe Junction.

e) Other Matters

Cotwall Bank junction

Chris Pearson, TWC, had confirmed at the Highways Liaison Meeting that the road layout is appropriate for this junction. The Parish Council will continue to ask for the signage and road markings to be monitored and updated as necessary.

886/02/23.C Matters from Telford & Wrekin Council

a) Rural Bus Initiative

The new service for the rural areas commences on 27th February 2023. This has been possible by Government Funding and addresses the needs of the majority of the rural areas of the Borough. Publicity will be available for the routes which will link to Wellington & Newport. Passengers can travel free on 27th and 28th February to trial the routes. It is intended that these will evolve and therefore all comments and suggestions are welcomed.

For anyone unable to use the bus due to mobility issues or lack of a route, a dial-a-ride and house-to-house service will be available.

Although bus stops are listed on the timetables, the bus is hail-and-ride so passengers can ask for it to stop at any point along the route.

Further information has been made available regarding grants available for outdoor leisure activities which may benefit the new Track at High Ercall Village Hall.

It may be necessary to relocate the defibrillator within Roden as the property is to be sold. A Plan B is available if needed. Thanks were extended to Councillor Walker who offered to host the Roden defibrillator if it needs to be relocated at any time in the future.

Clerk's Report

a) Roden Play Area

The resurfacing is well underway and the site will be completed for the hand-over on 1st April. Thanks were extended to the landowner for making the arrangements for the legal transfers.
